Fifth. I hereby direct my executors to make a settlement with my son in law Felix G. Drumright and if thereis anything due my estate by him the amount is to be charged as advances made to my daughter his wife and deducted from any property I may leave to her and I also direct my executors to charge my son Sam E. Plott with the amount of a judgement

I paid for him amounting to fifty dollars said amount to be deducted from any property I may leave him.

Sixth. I give and direct to my beloved wife Sarah Plott all my real and personal property, not otherwise bequeathed or devised in this my will. For and during her natural life and at her death it is to be equally divided between my children share and share alike and if any of my children die before this will goes into effect then and in that event, the children of such child shall take in place of their ancestor and it is my wish that my two daughters Margarette and Effie shall be supported by their mother out of my estate so long as they are unmarried and remain at home with her without being charged with their maintenance.

Seventh. I hereby constitute and appoint my friend W. G. Lewis and my son John Mc. F. Plott my lawful executors to all intents and purposes to execute this, my last will and testament according to the true and intent meaning of the same.
